

In the name of God Amen I Collier Harrison of the County of Charles City, being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, revoking all others, do make ordain and publish the following to be my testament and last Will. Imprimis I recommend my soul to God, and request that my body be decently intred as near my Brothrs on the hill north of my house as may be convenient. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Collier Harrison the following slaves to wit, Smith - Tom and his wife, Amy with her children and increase, blaboe her children and increase - Stable - Tom and his sister Britty her children and increase, John son of yellow Sally and Milly the sister of said John, and her increase to her my said Daughter and her heirs forever. Item whereas my dear departed Brother Braxton has very liberally provided for my dear Son Braxton by his testament and last Will, and it is my Will and desire that all my Children should have and receive a provision as nearly equal as my circumstances will permit therefore I only give and bequeath to my dear Son Braxton the following property as a token of my affection to wit my small Gun, when he arrives at the age of eighteen years, and at the death of his Mother his choice of any one of any slaves male, or female to him and his heirs forever, except that his choice shall not extend to any of the slaves that I have herein before given to my Daughter Elizabeth Collier nor to a little Girl by name of Britty, which I bought at a Sheriffs sale in the Town of Petersburg. Item I give & bequeath to my dear Son Robert Carter after the death of his Mother the tract of land wherein I now reside called Kittlewan in which are included the tracts called Borchhursts, Logos, Southalls and Bowers to him and his heirs forever, but my intention is that if my Son Braxton die without lawful issue, and under the age of twenty one year, that my Son Robert Carter make his election either to take Kittlewan, or Farmers rest: if he take Kittlewan, then I give and bequeath to my said daughter Elizabeth Collier the farmers rest to her and her heirs forever but if my said son Robert Carter elect to take Farmers Rest then I give and bequeath to my said Daughter Elizabeth Collier after the death of my dear wife Kittlewan including the tracts already mentioned to her & her heirs forever, and whereas I am doubtful what effect the law might have on the estate of my son Braxton given to him by his Uncle Braxton in case my said Son die under the age of twenty one years, whether I should be entitled to Farmers Rest as heir at law to my Brother, or wheather the same would decend to the heirs of my son Braxton, that is to my daughter Elizabeth Collier and to my son Robert Carter in equal Moieties, or to them in proportion to the whole and half blood, or to the said Robert Carter solely: therefore to provide for each contingency, I give and devise as follows to wit; if I should be entitled as heir at law to Farmers Rest on the death of my son Braxton, then I give and bequeath the same to the lawful issue of my said Son to them and their heirs forever and in default of such issue, then I give and bequeath Farmers Rest

with the slaves and stocks thereon to my Son Robert and his heirs forever, upon condition that he relinquish all claim, title and interest in and to Kiltiewan including the tracts already mentioned, and three fourths of the slaves and all the stocks thereon to his Sister Elizabeth Collier and her heirs forever, the said slaves to be selected in families, the other fourth part of the slaves to go to my said Son Robert on his taking Farmers rest. If my Son Robert and my daughter Elizabeth Collier should be considered under the Law as heirs to their Brother Braxton either in equal Moieties or in proportion to the degree of half and whole blood my intention still being that my daughter Elizabeth Collier, and my Son Robert Carter, should the one have Farmers rest, and the other Kiltiewan including the tracts already mentioned with the stocks on each, and the slaves thereon except one fourth part of the slaves which are to go to Farmers Rest as mentioned in the last clause, unless my Son Robert Carter relinquish all claim title and interest either in Kiltiewan, and the slaves and stocks thereon and Farmers Rest with the slaves and stocks thereon and one fourth part of the slaves of Kiltiewan as above mentioned to his Sister Elizabeth Collier, so that she have the one or the other. I hereby revoke and annul all bequests to him given by this Will, and unless my daughter Elizabeth Collier relinquish all claim title and interest to Farmers Rest with the slaves and stocks thereon, and one fourth part of the slaves at Kiltiewan which she may derive from or by the death of her Brother Braxton to her Brother Robert on his coming to take Farmers Rest with the stocks and slaves thereon and one fourth part of the slaves from Kiltiewan then I hereby revoke all bequests to her given by this Will. Now if my son Robert Carter die without lawful issue, and under the age of twenty one years, then and in that case I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Collier after the death of my dear wife Kiltiewan including the lands already mentioned as included therein together with the stocks and three fourths of the slaves thereon to be selected in families to her and her heirs forever. Now I request and desire that the land which my Brother Braxton purchased of Francis Christian, and which my Brother directed by his Will to be sold may be sold on such terms as my executors may think most advantageous to be applied in discharging his my said Brothers debts and legacies; but if the slave here mentioned in his Will to be sold, continue to conduct himself well, I desire that he may not be sold: if the funds already appropriated by my Brother for the discharge of his debts and legacies, and also the funds hereafter appropriated by myself for the discharge of my debts be not sufficient it is my wish and desire that the crops at Kiltiewan and Farmers Rest be applied to discharge the balance of his debts and legacies, and also my debts after allowing a support and maintenance to my wife and children. Now I lend to my loving & beloved wife Bersheba during her life my plantation called Kiltiewan including

the tracts already mentioned, and all my slaves not before given to my daughter Elizabeth Collier together with the horses, mares, cattle & sheep & hogs plantation utensils, household and kitchen furniture, except the furniture herein after given to my daughter Elizabeth Collier. After my Brother's debts & legacies are paid and also my debts, then I give the profits accruing from Farmus Rest to my dear Wife untill my Son Bampton arrives to the age of twenty one year for the better support and maintenance of my dear Wife and Sons, and my daughter Elizabeth Collier as long as she my daughter chooses to reside at Killiswan, and also for the education of my sons Bampton and Robert Carter, to which I beg her most affectionate attention! My Will intention and desire however is, that if my dear Wife may that on that court taking place that she be not intitled to or receive any of the profits or emoluments arising from Farmus Rest, but that the same go to the maintenance and education of my two Sons till my son Bampton arrive to the age of twenty one year. It is my Will and desire that the surplus profits of Farmus rest after the maintenance and education of my two Sons in the court of their mothers marrying again may be laid out in any way that my executors may think most advantageous for the mutual benefit of my said Sons. Item I give and bequeath to my dear daughter Elizabeth Collier and her heirs forever after the death of my dear Wife, One fourth part of all the slaves and their increase to be taken in families, which I have loaned to my dear Wife during her life, and the remaining three fourths part of the said slaves and their increase, I give and bequeath to my dear Son Robert Carter to him and his heirs forever together with the plantation utensils, stocks of horses Cattle, sheep and hogs, household and kitchen furniture. Item In case that all my children die under the age of twenty one year and without lawful issue then and in that case my Will and desire is that after the death of my dear Wife the estates herein before devised and bequeathed to them go and remain to Collier Harrison Minge to him and his heirs forever, but in case of his death under the age of twenty one year and without lawful issue, then I give and bequeath Farmus Rest with the slaves and stock thereon with one fourth part of the slaves at Killiswan to John Dandridge Son of Rebecca Gocke if he elect to have the same in preference to Killiswan and the tracts mentioned as including therein the stocks of Cattle, sheep and hogs, and three fourths of the slaves thereon, but if he prefer Killiswan & the stocks & three fourths of the slaves thereon, then I give and bequeath the said plantation called Killiswan the stocks and three fourths of the slaves thereon to him the said John Dandridge his heirs forever, and which of the said plantations and stocks and slaves that the John Dandridge may not elect to have I give and bequeath to George Minge Son of John Minge to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Collier to her and her heirs forever, all the furniture in the room now occupied by her and her use of the said room as long as she thinks proper to occupy it. I also give and bequeath to my said daughter and to her heirs forever after the death of my dear Wife the little negro girl Britty and her increase which I purchased at a Sheriff's sale in Petersburg but if my said daughter be dead at the death of my Wife then I give the said Negro girl Britty and her increase to my Son Robert Carter his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my dear Wife and to her heirs forever my chariot & harness, and my two carriage horses. Item I give and bequeath to my dear Wife my silver rim and castors purchased by herself to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Collier & to her heirs forever a silver hoop bought by herself. Item I request and desire my executors herein after named to pay off and discharge all my just debts & for that purpose I appropriate the following property to wit, all the debts due me of every description & which can be collected, my Heirs

of blooded Mares and colts except the Mare called Lady Darcall, which I desire may be kept on the estate, and produce applied, if necessary also to the discharge of my debts, but if they be discharged by the funds already mentioned, then her produce to be applied to the mutual benefit of my loving Wife, and beloved Son Robert Caster. Item It is my Will and desire that my brown yearling Colt by Jack Andrews out of Virago on the first of August next be put under the care of my hartsler Hall to be superintended and managed by my friend M^r. John Minge, who alone after trial made of him shall fix the time of disposing of him: and lastly I nominate and appoint my beloved Wife, my friend M^r. John Minge and my friend M^r. Benjamin Harrison of Berkeley executors to this my last Will and Testament, and guardian to my dear Children, earnestly soliciting their particular care and attention to the education of my dear Sons, which I hope may be as liberal as their estates will authorize and whereas I have the most unlimitted confidence in the honor, honesty and integrity of my said Executors I desire that they may not be compelled to inventory or appraise my estate, or to give security for the faithful administration thereof. I also give them full authority to sell all or any part of the stock on the Williams or Farmers rest plantations, and in short to do all things that to them may seem best for the promotion of the interest and happiness of all concerned. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this tenth day of October in the year of our Lord - One thousand eight hundred and nine.

And whereas by my last Will and Testament, bearing date the 10th of October 1800, I have bequeathed in fee simple to my loving Wife Bersheba Harrison my Carriage and Horses, and my team & Barstors, and upon consulting my dear Wife I find it her desire, to have them given her during her natural life only; I do hereby give the aforesaid Carriage and Horses and Team and Barstors to her for the above mentioned period of her natural life, and at her death my Will and desire is that they be given to my dear Son Braxton together with my secretary, and do hereby nominate and appoint my friend Alexander Harrison, one of my executors to this my last Will and Testament with a desire that he Qualify thereto at the death of my friend John Minge Sen^r. who is above named an Executor, and I also nominate and appoint my young friend John Minge jun^r. Son of John Minge above mentioned one of my Executors in the event of his Fathers death, and desire that he may Qualify so soon as he arrives at the age of twenty one years, and it is also my Will & desire that my Executors do take charge of, and manage the estate of my dear Brother Braxton Harrison, who is now deceased, and whose estate I have had the entire management of since his death agreeable to a clause in his Will. And also I desire that my Executors make sale of any unmanageable

Negro, or Negroes that belong to my estate, provided they replace other Negroes of equal value. signed this 13th November 1809.

Ordered to be recorded and on the motion of the said John Minge who made oath according to law and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Thirty thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs (the will directing that no security should be required) Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. ^{Liberty reserved the other executors in and will named to join in said probat when they may think fit.} Teste Wyatt Walker Clk
