Will

I Edward Major of the County of Chas City do make and Ordain this writing as and for my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all other Wills hitherto made by me. -

Imprimis. It is my Will and desire that all my just debts be paid, to accomplish which I subject such part of my estate as will be sufficient for that purpose. - Item. It is my will and desire that at the end of the present year or as soon thereafter as practicable or Convenient my executor make sale of the perishable part of my estate together with the Crops of all kind and the proceeds of said sale or the balance thereof remaining in the hands of my executor after the payment of my debts to be applied to the support of my wife ^{and children} and the education of my Children. Item. It is my Will and desire that my wife be supported out of the profits of my estate as long as she remains my widow or stands to the provision made her by this my will; but on her marrying again or renouncing the provisions made her hereby that she have such part of my estate as the laws of the Country entitle her to. - Item. I give and bequeath to my son Edward Major all the lands I am entitled to under the will of my father at the death of my mother and my tract of land called Burlington to him my said son Edward Major and his heirs forever and direct that the said tract called Burlington be leased or rented out till the death of my mother and the money arising from said lease or rent to be for the benefit of my said son Edward Major to him and his heirs forever. - Item. It is my will and desire that as soon after decease as practicable my executor have carried into effect the Trust

deeds.
