I Eleonor Brewer of Charles City County being sick and weak but in sound mind memory and understanding do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following, for the natural love and affection which I have to John Southall whom I have raised and have been to him a foster Mother - Infirmis. I give and bequeath unto the said John Southall Stott Son of Mr. William Stott and Rebecca W. Stott his Wife the money left me by Mr. James Williams deceased also balance due me from Henry Southall for the purchase of some cattle to him and his heirs forever. Item, I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Elizabeth Southall one white gown and one purple and white ditto. Item, I give and bequeath unto Sally R. Stott one white gown also one light ground callico ditto - Item, I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Rebecca Bogan one dark ground callico gown. Item I give and bequeath unto Mary Backhurst ~~one~~ new dark ground callico gown - and lastly I nominate and appoint my good friend Mr. John Southall Son of Henry Southall my whole and sole executor to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me. I Jesse Ladd of Charles City County, being weak in body, but in perfect sense mind and memory, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, revoking and disannulling all former wills heretofore made by me. Infirmis. I give and bequeath to my Son Samuel Ladd part of my land, which he hath now in possession, beginning at a corner of William Barnes's, so along the said Barnes's line to Brother William Ladd's thence along Brother Williams line to my fence, thence a North course along as my fence runs to his line (the land he bought of Crew), thence along the said line to the place first mentioned, containing by estimation twenty Acres be the same more or less, to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Jesse Ladd, the land and plantation whereon I now dwell containing by estimation one hundred and twenty acres be the same more or less, also one feather bed and furniture, One Horn (if living) One Cow and Calf, one sow and pigs, one large Gun, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Peggy Ladd fifty pounds Cash, one feather bed & furniture, One Horn (if living) One Cow and Calf, One Loom slays and Hammers, spinning Wheel and cart to her and her heirs forever: also my will and desire is that she may live with my Son Jesse, as long as she lives single and they can agree, and so they should not agree that she may have the shed to the dwelling House, and not be debarred from fire Wood.
