 I give and dispose of in manner following. First I give and bequeath
 to Elizabeth Richison Alfriend one feather Bed, and furniture to her &
 her heirs forever. Item secondly I give and bequeath to the said. Elizabeth
 R. Alfriend one of my best Gowns to her and her heirs. Lastly I do
 nominate and appoint Stephen Davidson my whole and sole executor
 of this my last will, and testament, revoking and disannulling all other

At a monthly court held for Charles City County on Thursday the 19th day of
December 1793 The afore written last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Parrish decd
proved by the oath of John Willard and continued for further proof, Stephen
Davidson the executor therein named appeared in court and refused to take
upon himself the execution thereof. And on the motion of William Parrish sen^r
who made oath thereto according to law, and together with John Christian his
security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of fifty pounds
with such condition as the law in this case directs. certificate is granted him for
obtaining letters of administration with the Will annexed in due form.
