God to bless me with do give and dispose of the same in the manner follow-
ing that is to say. I give to my Son John H. Phillips my dark bay colt
now two years old to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my Son Bena-
min Phillips my bay Coalt foaled this spring to him and his heirs forever.
Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth S. Phillips, One choice Bed Bedstead
and furniture complete, and one Kipper (being the same she has called
hers to this time) to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my Son
Irby Phillips One Shilling to him and his heirs forever. Item I give
to my Son James Phillips One Shilling to him and his heirs forever.
Item I give to my Son Joshua Phillips one shilling to him & his heirs forever.
Item I give to my Son Francis Phillips One shilling to him & his heirs forever.
Item I give to my Son John H. Phillips, and Benjamin Phillips, and my Daughter
Elizabeth S. Phillips, after the payment of all my just Debts all the balance
of my estate of whatever kind or nature whatever to share & share alike

to them and their heirs forever. My will and desire is that my Executor as soon as he
 may think it necessary to make provision for the payment of my just debts that he sell such
 part or parts of my estate not specifically given as he may think sufficient for the
 purpose. My desire is that the debt that now stands against me of -- twelve
 pounds ten shillings principal being the debt originally contracted with William
 Willis for the purchase of my boy Mairi to be paid with, or out of the debt owing
 to me by Littleberry Joby, having paid into his hands for the special purpose
 of discharging this claim against me, the full amount of principal and
 interest. But nevertheless should it so come to pass that the said Littleberry Joby
 will not voluntarily pay, nor cannot be compelled to do so, that in that event
 my Executor make provision for its payment as before directed.
 Item I give to my Son William Phillips one shilling to him and his heirs
 forever. My will and desire is that my estate be not appraised, nor my
 Executor compelled to give security unless at any time the Court should
 find it absolutely necessary to prevent waste -- And lastly I nominate &
 appoint my friend Francis M. Joby my Executor to this my last will and
 testament revoking all others. Given from under my hand and seal
 this seventh day August one thousand eight hundred & five

last will and Testament of Elizabeth Phillips was this day pre-

Witnesses thereto, ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the
said Executor, who made oath as the law directs, and entered into
Bond in the penalty of five hundred Dollars, conditioned as the
law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat
