At a Monthly Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse on Thursday the nineteenth day of June 1800 The aforewritten last Will and Testament of Elizabeth Spraggins decd was proved by John Kance Jr a witness thereto and admitted to

recorded and on the motion of John Nance senior one of the executors therein named who made oath as the law directs and together with Edward Walker and Stephen Shell his securities entered into, and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two hundred dollars conditioned according to law, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. The other executor named in the said Will by his letter to the Court refused to join the Probat.

The Common Council of Virginia to Thomas G Peachy William Prentiss and Elias Parkers Magistrates of the town of Petersburg greeting Whereas William Scott and Sarah his wife of the County of Dinwiddie by their certain Indenture of bargain and Sale bearing date the 18 day of July one thousand seven hundred and ninety two have sold and conveyed unto Samuel Eblew one certain tract or parcel of Land lying and being in the County of Charles City containing by estimation one hundred acres more or less, and whereas the said Sarah cannot conveniently travel to the Court of the said County to make acknowledgment of the said conveyance therefore to you or any two or more of you is given full power and authority to receive the same
