being very ill and weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory do make and
ordain this my last Will and Testament Voz. principally and first of all I recommend
my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and as to my body I recommend it
to the Ground to be buried in a Christian like and decent Manner at the discretion
of my Executors and as Touching such worldly Estate as it hath been please God to
bestow on me within this life I give demise and dispose of in Manner and form as
following. Item I give and bequeath unto John Floyd one negroe boy Stephen to
him and his heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Wilkinson
one negroe boy James and two feather beds and furniture and all the rest of my
Estate, to him and his heirs for ever, but in case he should die before he should arrive
to the age of Twenty one years my will and desire is that John Floyd my Nephew
should have the said Estate to him and his heirs for ever. And lastly I leave my
Nephew John Floyd Executor and my friend William Rock Just. of this my last will
and Testament. Revoking and making Void and null all other former Wills by me made
and validating this only to be my last will and Testament. Witness my hand and seal
this 31st day of October 1799

At a monthly Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse on Thursday the eighteenth day of February 1802. The aforewritten last will and testament of Frances Wilkinson decd was presented in Court by William Rocke Junr one of the executors therein named and being proved by the Oaths of Edward Morgan and John Bell two of the Witnesses thereto ordered to be recorded, and on the motion of the said Executor who made oath thereto according to law and entered into bond with Edward Morgan and Terry Hitt his securities in the penalty of twelve hundred Dollars conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. Liberty reserved the other Executor to join in the probat when he may think fit.
