In the name of God Amen I Francis Ioby of Charles City County being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make, constitute, and ordain this my last will and testament revoking all others. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of January one thousand Eight hundred and eight. Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth H. Ioby one Negro Woman named Phillis together with her increase to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah H. Ioby one Negro Woman named Moll together with her increase to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my son Francis H. Ioby one negro man named Daniel to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my son Robert W. Ioby the following Negroes to wit, Lucy, Charles, Sally and Christiana at the day of his Marriage. But should my son Robert W. Ioby die without an heir, my will and desire is that the above named negroes Lucy, Charles, Sally and Christiana be divided share and share alike among my grand children here named to wit, William A. Ioby, Thomas W. Ioby, Francis Ioby son of Littlebury Ioby and Mary Ann Phillips to them and their heirs forever. I also give to my son Robert W. Ioby one Sorrell mare now used by him as his. Item I give to my grand daughter Mary Ann Phillips one Negro girl named Nancy at the day of her Marriage but should my grand daughter Mary Ann Phillips die childless my will and desire is that the negro girl Nancy together with her increase revert back to my estate. Item I give to my grand son William A. Ioby one small boy named Peter, but should my said grand son die without a child my will and desire is that the boy Peter go to my grand Daughter Mary A. Ioby and her heirs forever. My will and desire is that should my son Robert W. Ioby feel disposed to tent a boar he having obtained the approbation of Mr. Boles for doing so on the place whereon I now reside. In that event, that my stock of different hinds, boars, boar fudders and shucks remain on the place as they now are during the present year, and at the expiration of the year the new crop to be divided and my son Robert to have one half and the other half to be considered as my estate and at the expiration of the year my will and desire is the half of the new crops before mentioned together with my stock of horses, cattle, and hogs, Household and Kitchen furniture to be sold (as also every species of property I now own) specific legacies excepted for the payment of my just debts. I further give to my son Robert W. Ioby one choice bed and furniture and lastly I nominate my friends Peter West and David Royster executors of this my last will and testament. I William Lightfoot of Tedington, in the County of Charles City, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and recollecting the uncertainty of human life, do make and ordain the following to be my last ^{and} testament hereby revoking all other and former wills by me at any time made. My soul I bequeath into the hands of Almighty God relying with full hope on his Mercy and goodness; and my body I desire to be decently interred in the family burying ground at Tedington, where most of my relations lie. First having executed a deed for the greater parts of my slaves and other personal estate to William Allen Esquire of Hurry, in trust, with certain reservations therein expressed, I do hereby confirm to my several children therein named by my first wife and to my son in law George Blakey, all the estate to them respectively thereby given, or mentioned therein to be given to them respectively, whether of slaves, Money, houses, or any other thing. Secondly To my wife Ann Bleton Lightfoot, I devise and bequeath her during in one third of the lands, now belonging to me for her life, and her distributive share of the personal estate now remaining to me, meaning to give to her therein her legal rights and no more. Thirdly To my children by my present wife Ann Bleton Lightfoot, who have not been yet baptised, but are called Robert Amherst Lightfoot, and Sarah Lightfoot, and to any child, be it a son or a daughter, with whom she may be pregnant at the time of my Death, I give four hundred Dollars each.
