 In the name of God amen I Francis Joby of Charles City County being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make, constitute, and ordain, this my last will and testament revoking all others - In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of January one thousand Eight hundred and eight - Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth H. Joby one Negro Woman named Phillis together with her increase to her and her heirs for ever - Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah H. Joby one Negro Woman named Moll together with her increase to her and her heirs forever - Item I give to my son Francis H. Joby one negro man named Daniel to him and his heirs forever - Item I give to my son Robert W. Joby the following Negroes (to wit) Lucy, Charles, Sally and Christiana at the day of his Marriage, But should my son Robert W. Joby die without an heir, my will and desire is that the above named negroes Lucy Charles, Sally and Christiana be divided share and share alike among my grand children here named (to wit, William R. Joby, Thomas W. Joby, Francis Joby son of Littlebury Joby and Mary Ann Phillips to them and their heirs forever, I also give to my son Robert W. Joby one Bonnell mare now used by him as his. Item I give to my grand daughter Mary Ann Phillips one negro girl named Fanny at the day of her Marriage but should my grand daughter Mary Ann Phillips die childless my will and desire is that the negro girl Fanny together with her increase revert back to my estate. Item I give to my grand son William R. Joby one small boy named Peter, but should my said grand son die without a child my will and desire is that the boy Peter go to my grand daughter Mary J. Joby and her heirs forever - My will and desire is that should my son Robert W. Joby feel disposed to lend a brood he having obtained the approbation of Messrs. Joles for doing so on the place whereon I now reside, In that event, that my stock of different kinds, brood of born fodder and shucks remain on the place as they now are during the present year, and at the expiration of the year the new crop to be divided and my son Robert to have one half and the other half to be considered as my estate and at the expiration of the year my will and desire is the half of the new crop as before mentioned together with my stock of horses, cattle, and hogs, Household and kitchen furniture to be sold (as also every species of property I now own (specific legacies excepted) for the payment of my Just debts - I further give to my son Robert W. Joby one choice bed and furniture - and lastly I nominate my friends Peter West and David Royster executors of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto subscribed my hand and seal the day and date above written -

I William Lightfoot of Tedington, in the County of Charles City, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and reflecting the uncertainty of human life, do make and ordain the following to be my last, and testament hereby revoking all other and former wills by me at any time made My soul I bequeath into the hands of Almighty God relying with full hope on his mercy and goodness; and my body I desire to be decently interred in the family burying ground at Tedington, where most of my relations lie. First having executed a deed for the greater part of my slaves and other personal estate to William Allen Esquire of Surrey, in trust, with certain reservations therein expressed, I do hereby confirm to my several children therein named by my first Wife and to my son in law George Blakey, all the estate to them respectively thereby given, or mentioned therein to be given to them respectively, whether of Slaves, Money, house, or any other thing. Secondly To My Wife Ann Hopton Lightfoot, I devise and bequeath her dower in one third of the lands, now belonging to me for her life, and her distributive share of the personal estate now remaining to me, meaning to give to her therein her legal rights and no more. Thirdly To my children by my present Wife Ann Hopton Lightfoot, who have not been yet baptized, but are called Robert Amistead Lightfoot, and Sarah Lightfoot, and to any child, be it a son or a daughter, with whom she may be pregnant at the time of my Death, I give four hundred Dollars each

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in the hands of the administrator.
