The which with all the appurtenances thereto belonging I give to the said Nathaniel and Mary to them their heirs and assigns forever, after the decease of my living wife to whom I lend the said plantation during her natural life together with all my other estate of every nature & kind Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Susannah Jones the sum of twenty shillings. Item. I give & bequeath to my daughter Dorcas Wade the sum of Twenty dollars to her and her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Parker the sum of twenty shillings. Item I give and bequeath to my son Nathaniel and to my kinswoman Mary Hamblett above named after the decease of my wife, all my household & kitchen furniture, stock of horses cattle sheep and hogs as also all my personal estate of every kind to them their heirs and assigns forever, provided they will pay the several legacies bequeathed in the foregoing part of this will In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 23^d day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fourteen :-
