A Negro Woman named Sarah, one bay Mare, one choice bed and furniture; one Cow and six Sheep; Eight barrels Corn, and half my fodder two pewter dishes, and six plates, one small Iron pott, with hooks and racks, one Dutch or one Spoon with sleeves, and Harness, one bottom wheel and a pair of bands, one pine chest, 1 Helling Hog. to her and heirs forever - My further will and desire is that all the residue of my estate after paying my just debts be equally divided between my son John Hughes, and my grand Daughter Matilda Douglass wife to them and their heirs forever And further I constitute and appoint my friends James Walker and Edward Walker executors to this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have herein
