In the name of God amen I Mary Bradley of Charles City County and Parish of Westover being weak in body but of sound mind do make and do ordain this my last will and testament in manner and do form following: first of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it in sure certain hopes of the resurrection from the dead through the merits of Jesus Christ & my body to be buried at the discretion of my executors. Item I leave all my estate to be sold at the discretion of my executors & the money arising therefrom to be disposed of as follows. Item I give and bequeath to my son Stanhope Johnson ten dollars to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my son William Bradley one dollar to him & his heirs for ever. Item I give & bequeath to Edward Green Roach ten dollars to him and his heirs for ever which is to be kept on Interest till he shall arrive to the age of twenty one years, but should he die under that age his legacy to go to my son Stanhope Johnson. And all the remaining part of the money arising from the sale of my estate is to be equally divided between my two daughters to wit Elizabeth Bradley & Mary Bradley to them and their heirs for ever. I Write this whereof I have hereunto set my hands and seal this 15th day of April Anno Domini eighteen hundred and thirteen. I also appoint Henry Wells & Henry Freque Sr^r my lawful executors.
