Item, after my decease I give unto my son Edmund Whitt, Twenty five Cents, to him and his heirs forever. Item after my decease I give unto my son Claborne Whitt Twenty five Cents to him and his heirs forever. Item after my decease I give unto my beloved wife Lucretia Whitt all my land I now live on with all its improvements, all my stock of every kind and sort, all my house hold and kitchen furniture of every description, all the Crops that may be on hand and growing at the time of my death, in a word every thing that I may be possessed of; to her to dispose of as she may think proper. I leave no Executor to my will as I owe no man any thing, neither does any owe me. Given under my hand and seal this Seventeenth day of April One thousand eight hundred and twenty one.
