I James Bates Junr, of the County of Charles City do ^{constitute} make, and ordain
 this to be my last will and testament in the manner and form following—
 I Item, I give and bequeath to my mother, Nancy Bates, one hundred dollars
 to be paid, ^{her} out of a bond due to me from William Guerrent & others, which
 hundred dollars I desire should be receiv'd, by Thomas Humnicutt and do
 appoint him as trustee for my, ^{said} mother to pay the said sum as she may
 think best and most advisable. I Item I give and bequeath to my brothers
 Joseph D. and Joshua Bates and to my sister Elizabeth Bates the sum of
 one hundred dollars each, to be paid them out of the bond above mentioned,
 the balanc of said bond, I wish to be applied to the payment of my bond,
 due to d. Dickinsons, and if any ballances after the payment of said bond,
 I wish it to go to the payment of any Legacy hereafter mentioned. I Item
 I give and bequeath to my brother Joshua Bates a bond due me from
 Humnicutt, Warrins & Co of fifty dollars also my bay mare. I Item, I
 give & bequeath to my brother Joseph D. Bates my gig & harness. I Item
 I give and bequeath all the right, title & interest in the property which
 I hold in the State of Ohio, under the last will and testament of Uncle
 Joseph Sadder, to my two brothers Jos. D. and Joshua Bates & to my two sisters
 Henrietta Butler & Elizabeth Bates, to them and their heirs forever. I
 Item, I give & bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Bates, my bed & furniture which
 was given me by my Uncle Joseph Sadder. I Item, I give to my friend
 Matthew Hartgraves my big coat as a testimony of my regards. I Item,
 I give to my aunt Elizabeth Winstons, twenty five dollars as a testimony
 of my regards. Lastly, my will & desire is that my executor should sell
 all the property which I possess not previously willed away, and to
 collect all my outstanding debts, and the money arising from the sale
 of the property and from the collection be first applied to the payment
 of all my just debts, and the surplus next to be applied to the payment of
 any Legacy after which, the balance of the money remaining in the
 hands of my executor I wish to be equally divided between the following
 persons, To wit, Nancy Bates, Joseph D. & Joshua Bates & Elizabeth Bates. —
 I do hereby appoint my relation Thomas Humnicutt executor to this my
 last will and testament. Given under my hand this 21th day of 12th month
 1819. —

 read in Court and proved by the affirmation of Robert Cross and Robert Ladd
 the witnesses to the same and ordered to be recorded. Thomas Hummell the
 executor named in the said will, by his note in writing, refused to take upon
 himself the burden of the executorship. And thereupon on the motion of
 Joshua Bates who affirmed according to law and with Robert Ladd and
 Oliver Ladd his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the
 penalty of seven hundred dollars conditioned as the law directs, Certificate
 is granted him for obtaining letters of administration of the Estate of said
 James Bates Jun^r dec^d, with his will annexed in due form.

Robert Evans of Charles City County being weak in body but of sound
 mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament
 revoking and annulling all former wills heretofore made by me. First, my will and
 desire is that all my just debts be paid by my executors hereafter named. Item,
 I give and bequeath unto my relative Hannah Rochester (now living with me) the
 sum of five hundred dollars to be paid her out of some of the first moneys that
 can be collected, also one large table, to her and her heirs forever. Item, I give
 and bequeath unto my grand-son Oliver Ladd one half acre lot of land with all
 its appurtenances, situate, lying and being in Petersburg, on the north side of water,
 or old street, now in the possession of George & John Zimmerman, also a
 lot or piece of land (undivided) lying and being in Miles Township in the
 County of Delaware, in the State of Pennsylvania, together with one
 mahogany desk and book-case, one mahogany dining table and twelve
 mahogany chairs, all which, I give to him ^{and} my said, ^{grand} son Oliver Ladd, to
 him and his heirs forever, but should my two grand-children, Oliver and
 Anna Maria Ladd, die without lawful issue, then my will and desire is
 that the beforementioned lots of land with their appurtenances, be equally
 divided between the children of my two sisters Alice Morris and Ann
 Copeland share and share alike, also my will is that the above mentioned
 property be under the direction and management of Samuel and Evans Morris
 in West Marlborough in the County of Chester, in the State of Pennsylvania
 aforesaid. Item, I give and bequeath unto the owners of Grayley run mowing
 fifty dollars for the purpose of enclosing and making such repairs as may
 be necessary to the graveyard at said place. Item, I give and bequeath unto
 my grand daughter Anna Maria Ladd, one mahogany bureau one silver
 table, five silver table, and twelve silver tea spoons, also the bed which I now
