 James Vaughan being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make and ordain
 Will this to be my last will and testament, revoking all other Wills
 heretofore made by me in manner and form following. VIZ
 I give and bequeath to my loving wife Mary Vaughan One thousand
 dollars in cash, One top-gig and harness, One horse by the name of
 Charley, half of all my household and kitchen furniture, half
 of all my stock of horses cattle sheep and hogs, half of all my
 plantation utensils together with half the provisions on hand of
 every kind and one half the crop or crops that may be growing
 to her and her heirs forever. It is also my wish that my wife
 may have the liberty of taking such articles as she may choose
 of the abovementioned property at their appraisement to the
 value of one half of the appraisement of said property. I also
 give to my wife two hundred dollars a year so long as she
 may continue single and unmarried and the service of black
 boy by the name of Henry Roper untill he shall arrive to
 Lawfull age - should a suit hereafter be instituted and a rec-
 overy had against my estate for the amount of a legacy in
 money which I received from the executor of John Saddle dead under
 a clause in said Saddle's will in the following words VIZ Item I
 give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Saddle the said
 and plantation wherein I now live, together with one pine
 chest ~~cupboards~~ with its contents &c &c then ^{my wish to that} the amount of
 such recovery shall be deducted from the thousand dollars
 directed by the above clause in this will to be paid to my
 wife - Item I give ^{and bequeath} unto my brother Shadrack Vaughan two hun-
 dred dollars to him and his heirs forever - Item I give and
 bequeath to my three half brothers Matthew John and Henry
 Vaughan each of them One hundred dollars to them and their
 heirs forever - Item I give and bequeath to my nephew William
 Drake two hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever -
 Item I give and bequeath to my nephew John Drake One
 hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever - Item I
 give and bequeath to my niece Eliza Norment five dollars
 per year

(468) per year for twenty years to come, should she live long. Item
I give to my niece Deborah Norment ten dollars per year until
she shall attain the age of twenty five years should she live so long
Item I give to my brother in Law Benjamin Haines Saddle Two
hundred dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my
friend William Prosser the sum of One hundred dollars as a
testimonial of my friendship for him to him and his heirs
forever (and) to my friends Richard Maddill and Walter Gregory
from the same motive and in the same manner I give and bequeath
the sum of fifty dollars each. Item I give and bequeath unto my
cousin Joshua Cren in the state of Ohio, Two hundred dollars to
him and his heirs forever. Item I give to my Cousin Benjamin
Cren of Ch³ City County brother of Joshua Cren Two hundred
dollars to him and his heirs forever Item I give to James Kiffin
of Chancellery hills fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever. Item
I give to Edward Wallis fifty dollars to him and his heirs forever.
Item It is my wish that Charles Sightfoot Norment should continue
at school until his board clothing and schooling shall be equal
to what my sister Sarah Vaughan left at my discretion for his
benefit being the one thirds part of said legacy after deducting
from said thirds the sum of fifty dollars as it stands charged
upon my book. Item I give and bequeath to my brother Benjamin
Vaughan's children namely Samuel, Boling, Joseph, John, Benjamin
Ann Lucy Margaret (and) Charles M Vaughan the sum of three hundred
dollars each. But the same is not to be paid until they respectively arrive
to the age of twenty five years nor shall said children or either of
them have power to dispose of in any manner whatever, their or his
or her interest in this legacy until they he or she shall
or may have attained the age of twenty five years after and if
they disposition of the same by deed or other conveyance
or by any covenant or contract to convey, shall be made, ^{or made} by action
of said children or any of them then the bequest to such
child or children making or undertaking to make the same
is to be considered null and void and is hereby fully
revoked. Item I give and bequeath to my nephews
Samuel and Charles Sightfoot Norment (and) my niece
Deborah

Deborah Norment to each of them the sum of three hundred dollars as they respectively attain the age of twenty five years and this bequest is made upon the same conditions and subject to the same restriction as exists in the preceding clause relating to the children of my brother Benjamin Vaughan - Item I give and bequeath unto Samuel Hargrave, Robert Crew and Robert Sadek my three whole shares in people of colour viz. Wolee, Thomas, Daniel, and Benjamin Dixon in special trust and confidence that they will extend to said people of colour all and every privilege of freedom and do all and every act or acts to consummate their freedom that I myself could do according to the laws now in force or which may hereafter be enacted - And should they trust at any time be abused to the injury of said people of colour, or my wish and intention in this respect be disappointed, then on complaint either of said people of colour or other person being made to the Wyanoke monthly meeting of the society of friends, such meeting is hereby full authorized and requested, to take such complaint into consideration and to do all and every act ~~and~~ acts touching the same which may be calculated to afford redress or advance my wishes - Item my will and desire is that my land ⁱⁿ Ohio be sold at the discretion of my executor and the money arising therefrom as also all the rest and residue of my ~~estate~~ ^{estate} not heretofore disposed of I give to my Brother Benjamin Vaughan's children viz Samuel, Boling Joseph, John, Benjamin Ann Suey, Margaret, and Charles A Vaughan and my nephews and niece Samuel, Charles S and Deborah Norment to be equally divided between them, share and share alike on their attaining respectively the age of twenty five years subject to the same restrictions limitations and conditions as are by this will declared in reference to the legacy of three hundred dollars heretofore given to each of them. And to render still more manifest my intention my will is that they shall have as well the interest which shall accrue on the principal as the principal itself on their attaining the age of twenty five years aforesaid, after deducting annually so much from said interest as will satisfy the sum of five hundred dollars charged on my estate as on annually to my wife so long as she may live by a previous clause

Clause and thus my ^{will} and in further explanation of said clause relating to said annuity I declare it is to be my wish that said annuity shall terminate on the death or marriage of my wife. And lastly I nominate constitute and appoint Robert Saddle of the County of Charles City executor of this my last will and Testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this seventeenth day of May in the year of our Lord and Saviour One thousand eight hundred and Twenty
