In the name of God AMEN the twenty eighth day of October 1792 I Am Tibbles of the County of Charles City and Parish of Westover being in good health and perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God therefore letting unto mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make this my last will and testament viz. Principally and first of all I gave and recommend my soul to God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent manner at the discretion of my friends not doulting but at the general resurrection I shall receive it again by the mighty power of God, and touching such worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose in the forme following and form. First of all I leave my wife either of my tracts of land which she used to live on during her widowhood, and the personal estate to be wised in case no waste to be made of at her marriage or death to return to any children and then to be divided as followeth, between Nancy, Betsy, Polly, Patty & Archibald Tibbles to them & their heirs forever, of the ballance of the land that my wife should not make chose of to be rented not for the benefit

(157) benefit of my children, I acknowledge this to be my last will and testament, Given under my hand and seal this day and year above mentioned.

The aforesaid last will and testament of John Fillbates deceased was presented in Court and proved by the oath of Charles Evans a witness thereto, and the said Evans also proved that James Bates another witness to said Will who is dead subscribed his name as a witness to the same in his presence, whereupon the said will is Ordered to be recorded Sally Fillbates widow of the testator appeared in Court and being questioned her right of administration on his estate which is Ordered to be Certified And on the motion of William Newell who made oath according to law and with Edward Proper and Reuben Francis his securities entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Three thousand dollars conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is granted him for obtaining letters of administration on said decedent's estate with his said will annexed in due form.
