And lastly, I hereby constitute and appoint my friend John H. Christian and my son Littleberry H. Bradley Executors to this my last will and testament hereby revoking all former Wills heretofore made (and direct that they shall not be held to give security for their Executorship. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and affixed my seal this thirteenth day of November 1815.

At a Court held for Charles City County the 20 day of December 1821.
This last will and testament of John Bradley decd. was presented in Court and proved by the oath of William H. Gregory a witness to the same, James Bates the other subscribing witness being dead, the said M^r H. Gregory being sworn deposeseth and do saith, that the said James Bates subscribed his name as a witness to said will in his presence. Matthew Bargrave being affirmed deposeseth and saith that he is well acquainted with the hand writing of James Bates and verily believes the name subscribed to said will as a witness is in the hand writing of said Bates; whereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of John H. Christian one of the executors in said will named who made oath according to Law (and entered into and acknowledged a bond in the penalty of Thirty thousand dollars, Conditions as the Law directs, no security being required by the will) Certificate is granted the said Christian for obtaining a probate of said will in due form. Liberty being reserved the other executor to join in the probate when he may think fit.

R^o W^o Christian & CoAnn Couplands
Will

In the name of God Amen: I, Ann Couplands do make and ordain this my last will and testament: It is my will and desire that all the property which I may possess at my death, or have a right to dispose of (except the Slave Tom hereafter mentioned) consisting chiefly of the Slaves and stocks and the increase thereof conveyed by William A. Harrison administrator of Carter B. Harrison, and by Benjamin Harrison administrator of Benjamin Harrison deceased, to James Wilson and Stephen W. Trent as trustees, in trust for my benefit and subject to my disposal, be divided into nine equal parts and one equal ninth part I give and bequeath to each of my five children William R. Coupland, Benjamin H. Coupland, David O. Coupland, Carter Coupland and Alice Ashley Butler: The remaining four ninths I bequeath unto my son William R. Coupland and Carter Coupland upon this special Trust and confidence that they will permit each of my married daughters Elizabeth B. Trent, Ann R. Randolph, Lucy H. Gay, and Susan Locke to have and enjoy during the term of their natural lives, the sole use and benefit of one of the said ninth parts respectively, the same not to be liable to the debts, or to the control of their husbands, and to go at the death of my said daughters to their children in such manner and in such proportions as they may by will or Deeds appoint and direct, and in default of such appointment the portion assigned, or held to the use of each of my said daughters to be equally divided among the children they may respectively leave.

I have already given a Slave to each of my children Benjamin H., David O., Carter and Susan. It is my wish that the Slaves thus given, the right to which I hereby confirm, should not be brought into the division; and that my said children notwithstanding the gifts aforesaid, shall have an equal portion of the residue of my said Slaves and other property, as before mentioned. I give and bequeath to my grandson Carter B. Harrison a negro boy named Tom. I nominate and appoint my sons William R. Coupland, Benjamin H. Coupland, David O. Coupland and Carter Coupland executors of this my last will. It is my wish that no security be demanded of them or either of them and that my estate be not appraised.
