

I Joseph Ladd of the County of Charles City & State of Virginia being under bodily indisposition but of sound mind and memory, being desirous of making distribution of the estate which kind prudence hath been pleased to bestow me with; to make and ordain this present instrument of writing to be my last Will and testament in manner and form following. - First. My will and desire is that my executor hereafter named shall at his discretion sell and dispose of all my estate both real and personal and out of the money thence arising first fully pay all my just debts, and then satisfy the further provisions of this my will. - And I do hereby vest in my said executor full power and authority to sell and convey as above mentioned any and every part of my lands or estate. - Item I give & bequeath to my loving sister Elizabeth Carris the sum of One hundred pounds to her and her heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to my loving sister Ann Bates the sum of One hundred pounds to her and her heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to the children of my dead brother James D Ladd to wit, Oliver and Anna Maria Ladd the sum of One hundred pounds to be paid each of them as they arrive at lawful age or shall marry.

the which I give them jointly, or fifty pounds to each.
 Item. - I give and bequeath to Thomas S. Pleasant and Joseph S. Pleasant children of my dead sister Mary Pleasant the sum of Fifty pounds each to be paid them as they arrive at lawfull age or shall marry. - Item. - I give and bequeath to my loving brother Benjamin W. Sadoe the sum of One hundred pounds to him and his heirs forever. - I also give and bequeath to my said brother Benjamin any one half of two lots and the improvements thereon being in the Town of Richmond and owned jointly by my said brother and myself, the which I give to my said brother his heirs or assigns forever, upon his paying into my estate the sum of One thousand dollars within three years after he shall become possessed of said property. - Item. - I give and bequeath to my loving sister Isabella Connecticut the sum of One hundred pounds to her and her heirs forever. - Item. - I leave in the hands of my Executor or his successor the sum of Five hundred dollars to be placed at interest for the benefit and support of my nephew Joseph Denson Bates during his natural life it being my wish that the interest thereof be annually paid my said nephew or expended for his benefit as may be judged best. I also give and bequeath to my said nephew Joseph D. Bates one feather bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever. - Item. - I give and bequeath to my dutiful nephew James Bates one feather bed & furniture, and the sum of Fifty pounds in cash to set up his trade with. - Item. I give & bequeath to my affectionate nephew Joshua Bates one feather bed and furniture and the sum of fifty pounds in cash to be paid him when he shall arrive at lawfull age or may marry, I also give to my said nephew Joshua Bates my Silver Watch to him and his heirs forever. - Item. - It is my will and desire that the Stock farm in Ohio owned jointly by brother Benjamin and myself may together with the stock on hand and the money in trade, be continued and kept on as it now is under the management of William Lewis so long as the said establishment shall be profitable, and so long as the said William Lewis shall conduct the business thereof to my executors satisfaction. And that no sale of said tract of land shall take place unless my executor shall think a sale thereof necessary. - Item. - I do hereby authorise and empower my executor hereafter named to use out of my estate at his discretion from time to time any sum or sums of money in all not exceeding One thousand dollars in vindicating the rights of black people through the medium of the meeting for sufferings or otherwise. - Item. - I give and bequeath to Billy and Jacob minor black boys under my care One hundred Acres of land in the State of Ohio patented in my name on the waters of Black River also the sum of fifty dollars each provided they shall continue faithfully to serve my brother Benjamin until they arrive at lawfull age. - Item. My will and desire is that after my debts are all fully paid, and the legacies by this my will bequeathed fully satisfied, the rest and residue of

of my estate of whatsoever nature or kind may be equally divided amongst my brother and sisters, and the children of my deceased brother and sister James D Ladd and Eliza Pleasant. That is to say, Chelinda Harris and her children or any she may hereafter have to share one sixth part. - Ann Bates and her children or any she may hereafter have to share one sixth part. - Oliver Ladd and Anna Maria Ladd children of my dead brother James Deson or the survivor of them to share one sixth part. - Thomas S Pleasant and Joseph S Pleasant's children of my deceased sister Mary, or the survivor of them to share one sixth part. - Benjamin W Ladd & any children he may have to share one sixth part. - Isabella Hunnicut and her children or any she may hereafter have to share one sixth part. - Lastly I nominate and appoint my affectionate and well beloved brother Benjamin W Ladd executor to this my last will and testament, and having full confidence in him desire that the Court may allow his qualification hereto without being required to give security.
