My will and desire is that after my debts are all fully paid, and the legacies by this my will bequeathed fully satisfied, the rest and residue of

of my estate of whatsoever nature or kind may be equally divided amongst my brother and sisters, and the children of my deceased brother and sister James D Ladd and Mary Pleasants.
