Charles City County, Virginia Wills 1789-1808
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In the name of God, amen ~~Littleberry~~ Perry
of Charles City County, of sound mind, and memory, do constitute, and
appoint this my last Will, and Testament, in manner, and form as follows
Viz^t. First, I recommend my soul to god who gave it, and my Body to
be buried in a Christian like manner, and then I proceed to dispose
of my worldly goods, as it hath pleased god to bless me with.
Item. My will, and desire is, that all my Just debts be first paid.
Item. I give and bequeath unto my son William Perry my Land I now live
on, to him, and his Heirs, forever, lawfully begotten, but, if he should die
before he arrives to the age of Twenty one years, in that case I give the
said Land to my daughter, Sally Perry, to her, and her Heirs, forever, law-
fully begotten.

Item. My will, and desire is, that all the residue of my estate whatsoever
be equally divided between my daughters Priscilla Perry, Lucy Perry, &
Sally Perry, to them, and their Heirs, ^{forever} lawfully begotten, but, if it should
be the case, that my son William should die, before he arrives to the age
of Twenty-one years, and my daughter Sally should be alive, to Heir the

before he arrives to the age of Twenty one years, in that case I give the said Land to my daughter, Sally Perry, to her, and her Heirs, forever, lawfully begotten.

Item. My will, and desire is, that all the residue of my estate whatsoever be equally divided between my daughters Priscilla Perry, Lucy Perry, & Sally Perry, to them, and their Heirs, ^{forever,} lawfully begotten; but, if it should be the case, that my son William should die, before he arrives to the age of Twenty-one years, and my daughter Sally should be alive, to Heir the Land, my will and desire is, that she should not come in for any part of my estate, given to my three daughters, but that it should be equally divided between my other two daughters Priscilla & Lucy. Lastly I constitute and appoint William Southall my whole, and sole Executor.

At a monthly Court, held for Charles City County, on Thursday the 20th day of June, 1793. The afore-written last Will, and Testament of Littleberry Perry, ~~decd~~, was proved by the oath of Turner Bell, one of the witnesses thereto, and ordered to be recorded. And on the renunciation of the executor therein named, and Lucy Perry, the widow to the said decedent, relinquishing her right of administration, to Robert Chandler, And on the motion of the said Chandler, who made oath according to law, and together with William Graves, his security, entered into, and acknowledged their bond, in the penalty of Two hundred ^{pounds}, conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is granted here for obtaining letters of administration, with the will annexed on the said decedent's estate in due form.
