thousand seven hundred and ninety three. -

At a monthly Court held for Charles City County on Thursday the seventeenth day of July 1794. The afore written Last Will and Testament of Margaret Edmondson deceased was proved by the oath of John Moddrop one of the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of Anne Harwood one of the Executors therein named and making oath thereto as the law directs, and together with Tralbing Lewis her security entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of five hundred pounds, conditioned as the law directs, Certificate is granted her for obtaining a probat thereof in due form. Liberty being reserved to the other Executors therein named to joine in the probate when she shall think fit.
