In the name of God Amen. I Marston Bradley of Charles City, sick and weak of body, but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form following. Item after my just debts are paid I give and bequeath to my Stephen James Marston Bradley the land whereon I now reside, one negro man Jerry, Jack, and one woman Charlotte to be kept in the hands of my Executor, until he becomes of age or twenty one years, he is to receive the hire, if occasion require it yearly if my Executor finds it unprofitable to him. the land to be rented yearly or sold at the discretion of my Executor, the above named negro to be hired out yearly until the said James M. Bradley becomes of age, and should not James M. Bradley survive the year of Twenty One, it is my will and desire that Emely Marston Winfree should have the above named property, when married or arrive to the age of twenty one. Item I leave Old Jim in the possession of Ben Parker to stand master for him, and to bequeath to him one choice cow. Item, I wish Vincy the daughter of Jim to go with her and Benj^a Parker is authorized to take her at the appraisement or have her valued by three disinterested men. Item, I give and bequeath to Ben Parker my gray Mare now in foal, if the colt lives to Benj^a Parker also my Gun to him and his heirs forever. Item I bequeath to W^m Rock my saddle and bridle. Item I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Parker one large chest. The balance of my estate to be sold to the benefit of James M Bradley if he arrives to twenty one if he does not to Emely Marston Winfree when she marries or arrive at the age of twenty one and to her heirs and assigns forever. Lastly I leave Benj^a Parker my executors of this my last will and testament revoking and making void all other wills heretofore made by me confirming this to be my last will and testament.
