Amen I Martha Apperson being in sound mind and memory and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and wishing to make some disposition of what earthly estate it has pleased Almighty God to bless me with do make and ordain this to be my last Will and testament in manner following -

Item I give and bequeath unto Elizabeth Murrell Daughter of my deceased brother William M. Murrell Twenty pounds and if she should die without heir to return to my estate -  
Item I give and bequeath unto Eliza Ann Folkes Daughter of Edw<sup>d</sup> Folkes my smallest Trunk and its contents to her and her heirs forever -  
Item I give and bequeath unto my Godson Camellon C. Folkes son of Edward Folkes my Tract of Land in Charles City County (being the same left to me by my deceased brother Thomas Murrell) and all the rest of my estate (after paying the above Twenty pounds left to Elizabeth Murrell) to him and his heirs forever -  
Item it is my will and desire that my friend Edward Folkes shall be my Executor I therefore nominate and appoint him as such to this my last Will - Given under my hand and seal this 20 day of May One thousand eight hundred and sixteen.
