Martha Trappell
 Will

In the name of God Amen. I Martha Trappell of the County of Charles City
 and State of Virginia being in low, and critical health, but of sound and disposing mind and
 memory, do make and admit this writing to be my last Will and Testament in manner
 form, and substance following to wit. I give and bequeath to my sisters Amey Griffith and
 Elizabeth Griffith my interest in the Negro boy John Key to them so long as they or either of
 them shall live, and at their deaths it is my Will and desire that the same may be given to
 my Niece Eleanor C. G. Harrable, but if she should die before she marries or becomes of
 lawful age, it is my Will in that case that the aforesaid interest in the negro boy should
 be equally divided between all the children of my sister Polly Burt.

Item. I give and bequeath to my two Sisters above mentioned Viz. Amey and Elizabeth
 Griffith all my interest in the household and kitchen furniture and stock of every sort
 now on the plantation, so long as they or either of them shall live, and at their deaths it is
 my Will and desire that the same may be given to, and equally divided between all the
 Children of my sister Polly Burt. Item. I give and bequeath to my two Sisters above men-
 tioned Viz. Amey and Elizabeth Griffith, all my interest in the tract of Land whereon
 I now live, so long as they or either of them shall live, and at their deaths I give the same to
 the eldest son of my brother John Griffith, called Thomas William. Item. I give residue
 of my property of every kind and description to my two Sisters before mentioned Viz. Amey and
 Elizabeth Griffith during their natural lives and at their deaths, a good bed and furniture
 is to be given to my Niece Eleanor C. G. Harrable, and the balance of my furniture to
 James O. Griffith the youngest son of my brother John Griffith. Item. I nominate and
 appoint my two Sisters Amey Griffith and Elizabeth Griffith to be the Executors of this my
 last Will and Testament with the privilege of qualifying without giving any security for the same.
 In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my hand and affixed my Seal this 23rd day
 of April 1741.
