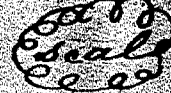

At a monthly Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse
on Thursday the twenty first day of July 1791

The aforementioned last Will and Testament of Mary Bonns
deceased was proved by the oaths of Wyatt Walker and John Williams
the witnesses thereto and Ordered to be Recorded. And on the motion
of Charles Bonns and Edward Clarke the executors therein named
who made oath according to law and together with John Boney
and Benjamin Leonard their securities entered into and
acknowledged their bond in the penalty of Five hundred pounds
conditioned as the law directs. Certificate is granted them for
obtaining a probat thereof in due form.
