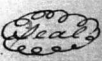

Item I give to niece Martha Gellajor thirty dollars to her ~~the~~ heirs forever. My will and desire is after the death of my daughter Martha Gellajor that all my estate be divided between my two grandchildren Mary E Lamb Sarah E Dancy and my grandson John F Thompson daughter Mary E Thompson, to them and their heirs. If it should so happen that Sarah E Dancy my grand daughter should die before she arrives to the years of twenty one or married, the part intended for her my will and desire is it shall be equally divided between Mary E Lamb and Mary E Thompson. And lastly I appoint William Gellajor and John Lamb my Executors to this my last will and testament, and revoking all others so constituted and Ordain this my last will and testament.
