County (being the same left to me by my deceased brother Thomas
Murrell) and all the rest of my estate (after paying the above Twenty
pounds left to Elizabeth Murrell) to him and his heirs forever -
Item it is my will and desire that my friend Edward Folkes
shall be my Executor I therefore nominate and appoint him
as such to this my last Will - Given under my hand and
seal this 20 day of May One thousand eight hundred and
sixteen.
