My will and desire is, that my two daughters Elizabeth Evins and Mary Hamblet should equally divide all the balance of my estate except the land, My desire is that my daughter Mary Hamblet should have full and quiet possession of all my land during her natural life, and at her death my desire and will is that it shall be the property of my grand daughter Frances Evins to her and her heirs forever. And lastly I appoint John Hamblet and Charles Evins Executors to this my last will and testament, whereunto I have set my hand and affixed my seal this second day of August in the year of our Lord Christ eighteen hundred and eleven. -
