

In the name of God Amen, I Matthew Moody being weak in body, but of sound mind and memory, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament revoking all others: Item I give and bequeath all my estate both real and personal to my loving wife Elizabeth Moody during her natural life, and should my child that she is now pregnant with live he or she shall at the death of my wife inherit all my estate to him or her and his or her heirs forever, and it is further my will and desire that my wife shall board and school my child during her life, but in case the child should die before my wife, in that case the whole of my estate is at the free disposal of my wife during her life, but at the death of my wife and child should he or she die without issue. I then give the whole of my estate to my nephew William Moody should he be living, should he die before my wife and my child should be dead, it is my will and desire that my wife should then have the whole of my estate to her and her heirs forever. Lastly I constitute and appoint my loving wife whole and sole executrix of this my last will and testament, and that she shall be allowed to qualify without giving security.
