estimation I hold them in all the rest and residue of my said personal estate I Give and
bequeath to my dear brothers Bernard and Williams in trust and for the sole and special
use and benefit of my dear sister Lee during her life free from the control of her husband General
Lee and after her death it is my will and desire that they the said Bernard and Williams or
their heirs or the heirs of one of them cany into effect any disposition she may make
thereof in writing in favour of her children and in failure of such disposition it is my will and
desire that said property be equally divided among all the children that my said sister Lee may
leave at her death, and lastly I nominate and appoint my said brothers Bernard and
Williams Executors to show my last will & testament In testimony whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & Seal this 31st day of May 1807

the seventeenth day of December 1807

The aforementioned last will and testament of Mildred Carter was this day in open
Court presented by Bernard Carter one of the executors therein named and being approved
by Patrick Henderson one of the Justices of the Peace I ordered to be recorded and on the
motion of the said executor who made oath as the Law directs and entered into bond
with William Carter his security in the penalty of thirty thousand dollars conditioned according
to Law Certificate is granted him for obtaining a probate thereof in due form William Carter an executor named
in the will appeared in Court & refused to qualify

I Give in manner and form following In pursues first of all I leave all my Just
Debts to be paid Them I Give to my son William Walker forty Shillings Current money of
Virginia to him & his heirs forever Them I Give and bequeath to my son Edward Walker
fifty acres of Land which is now in his possession beginning at Wm Graves Land running
across to Thomas Blanks Land by line trees, one Horse with by the name of Fearnot to
him and his heirs for ever. Them I Give and bequeath to my son James H Walker fifty
acres of Land adjoining the Lands of Edward Walker beginning at Wm Graves Land across
my Land To James I Bullfants line or Thos Blanks as may strike to him & his heirs
and his heirs forever * Them I Give and bequeath to my loving wife Jane Walker the Residence
of my Lands during her life or widowhood also a Negro Girl by the name of Siller also
Two beds & furniture Loom Wheel & pair of Cards all to her during her life or widowhood
I leave all the rest of my Estate to be sold and the money arising to be Equally Divided
between my wife Jane my son James H Walker & my Daughter Tabitha Walker
to them and their Heirs forever and Lastly I constitute and appoint my Good Friends
