

We Elizabeth Bullington and John Drake both of the age of 21 years or upwards do hereby Certify that during the last sicknesses of Porterfield Bradley late of this County, & of which he died, & at the place where said Bradley resided for the last three months immediately preceding his death, he the said Porterfield call'd on said Inv^r Drake who was then present to bear testi- money that in case of his death he gave what Estate he was entitled to by the death of his father & brother James to be equally divided between his brother Spotswood Bradley & half brothers John Drake & Ruebin Francis. That what estate he posseped independent of his brothers & fathers deaths as aforesaid he des- posed of the manner following - To Ruebin Francis a bond or note given by said Francis to sd^r decendant, a note of James Ware & a part of his Corn & fodder. To John Drake his house saddle & bridle & the balance of his Corn & fodder. And to Gideon B. Drake & James Irvine Drake Children of said Inv^r Drake he gave all the rest & residue of his estate which he possepd independent as above stated. We also certify that said Porterfield Bradley died on the night of the 7th April 1815. Given under our hands this 12th day of April 1815. —
