In the name of God Amen I Richard Raglin being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this my last Will and testament (recommending all others) in the manner following (that is to say) I lend to my affectionate wife Mary Raglin the use of the plantation whereon I now reside during her natural life or widowhood also the following Negroes (to wit) Joe, Cromstead, Daniel, and Sally until my youngest child shall attain to the age of seventeen years or my wife shall marry - I give to my wife Mary One Choice Horse, three Choice Cows, three Choice Sows & Pigs of any kind and two Choice Beds & furniture also eight Choice Hitting Hogs and as much Corn & fodder as may serve her until she can make a Crop Item. My will and desire is that in consideration of the foregoing disposition as relates to my wife Mary Raglin that she shew in Consideration thereof Keep and maintain with the help of such further provision as I shall hereafter make my three youngest Children (to wit) Delimah, Richard, and Edelina Raglans but should my wife not be content with the provision made for her, or marries, that in that event the Negroes Joe, Cromstead, Daniel and Sally and the two beds before mentioned return to my Estate without any provision made for her in my part other than what the law will afford Item. My will and desire is that my negroes (to wit) Tom, Carter, Lucia, Edmund, William and Peter shall be hired and the amount of hire together with the interest of the money that may be received of the Estate of Edmund P. Crump if any to be applied to the support and maintenance of my three last Children (to wit) Betsy C Raglin Joseph A Raglin and Phalina Ann Raglin or as much thereof as shall be necessary until my youngest living Child shall attain to the age of seventeen years Item. My will and desire is that whencesoever my youngest living Child shall arrive to the age of seventeen years that all of my estate both real and personal be brought together and divided in the following manner (to wit) my wife Mary Raglin to take one third part thereof according to law, and the other two thirds to be equally divided among my Children or their heirs - And lastly In nomine my wife Mary Raglin my Executive and my son Joseph Executor to this my last will Given under my hand & Seal Jan'y 28th 1810
