In the name of God Amen I Richard Raglen being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament (revoking all others) in the manner following (that is to say) I lend to my affectionate wife Mary Raglen the use of the plantation wherein I now reside during her natural life or widowhood also the following Negroes (to wit) Joe, Armistead, Danice, and Sally until my youngest child shall arrive to the age of seventeen years or my wife shall marry. I give to my wife Mary One choice Horse, three choice cows, three choice sows & pigs (if any) and two choice Beds Humilised also eight choice Killing Hogs and as much Corn & fodder as may serve her until she can make a crop. Now My will and desire is that in Consideration of the foregoing disposition as relates to my wife Mary Raglen that she shall in Consideration thereof keep and maintain with the help of such further provision as I shall hereafter make my three youngest Children (to wit) Delimah, Richard, and Adeline Ragland's but should my wife not be content with the provision made for her, or marries, that in that event the Negroes Joe, Armistead, Daniel and Sally and the two beds before mentioned return to my Estate without any provision made for her on my part other than what the law will afford. Now My will and desire is that my negroes (to wit) Tom, Carley, Livia, Edmond, William and Peter shall be hired ~~and~~ the amount of hire together with the interest of the money that may be recovered of the Estate of Edmond P. Crump (if any) to be applied to the support and maintenance of my three first Children (to wit) Betsy C. Raglen Joseph A. Raglen and Thalina Ann Raglen or as much thereof as shall be necessary until my youngest living child shall attain to the age of seventeen years. Now My will and desire is that whenever my youngest living child shall arrive to the age of seventeen years that all of my estate both real and personal be brought together and divided in the following manner (to wit) my wife Mary Raglen to take one third part thereof according to law, and the other two thirds to be equally divided among my Children or their heirs - And lastly I nominate my wife Mary Raglen my executrix and my son Joseph Executor to this my last will.
