In the name of God Amen, I Henry Vaughan of Charles City County being of sound mind and memory, do make and Ordain this to be my last will and testament, and forever following, that is to say, first of all, I commend my soul to God who gave it me, and my body to be buried by the side of my daughter Harriet. Then, I have given to my daughter Elizabeth Battle in her lifetime, One negro boy by the name of Lee, One feather bed and furniture and One small Cradle, which I gave to her and her heirs forever, Then I give to my daughter Mary E. Taylor, One negro girl by the name of Eliza and One feather bed and furniture which she has in possession, which I give to her and her heirs forever, Then, I give and bequeath to my daughter Phylamy Ann Vaughan One negro girl by the name of Calcy with her increase, and One choice feather bed and furniture, also One bellmetal Kettle, which I give to her and her heirs forever. Then I give to my daughter Deborah Folkes One feather bed and furniture which she has in possession also One negro woman by the name of R-day and her increase which I give to her and her heirs forever. Then I give to my daughter Ann E. Vaughan One negro girl by the name of Lucy and her increase forever, also the second choice feather bed and furniture and One Bell metal Piece mortar and One Iron Tea Kettle which I give to her and her heirs forever. Then I give my negro man Whitch together with what Carpenter Tools he has been used to work with, jointly and equally to my daughters Phylamy A. Vaughan and Ann E. Vaughan to them and their heirs forever, they to see him taken good care of and treated well. I also give them jointly and equally my gig and harness together with choice of my horses which I give them and their heirs forever. Then I give and bequeath, to my grand son Fleming A. Battle One negro girl of a melate couler by the name of Mary, which I give to him and his heirs forever, provided he lives to arrive to lawful age, which will be the twenty sixth day of August in the year One thousand eight hundred and thirty (1830) and the girl to be kept in the hands of my Executors, until that time and if my Grand son should die before he comes of lawful age, in that case my will and desire is the said girl Mary shall be equally divided between all my children which I give to them and their heirs forever. Then I give my land and plantation whereon I now live, by estimation 324 Acres equally to my four daughters, Mary E. Taylor, Phylamy A. Vaughan, Deborah Folkes and Ann E. Vaughan which I give to them and their heirs forever, Except One half Acre to be reserved for a burying place for my family with
