Snipes out of the money for the tuition of the said Boys - I now request my friend and Neighbour Benjamin Barrow Mary D Snipes my loving Wife) to see this my last will and testament executed, In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 21st of December Anno. Domi. 1808
