of One hundred pounds to be appropriated by my executor -  
here after named towards their support and education in such  
manner as he may judge best. And Lastly I nominate and  
appoint my beloved brother James Vaughan executor of this my  
last will and testament of whom I wish no security taken, my  
confidence in him being compleat. - In witness whereof I  
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this eighteenth day  
of the sixth month One thousand eight hundred and fourteen
