Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my Son Eaton Christian, and my Daughter Nancy, who intermarried with Isaac Hill all the monies that I am entitled to as a claimant in consequence of a Mercantile Partnership entered into by Parlick Christian & Co. and Christian and Lada to them and their heirs forever. Fourth & lastly, I give and bequeath to my two grand sons John & Timothy and Henry & Timberlake the balance of my estate & every kind and description except that heretofore given to be placed into the hands of Wm A Christian whom I appoint as my executor to this my last Will and Testament, who is authorized to appropriate the same in any manner he thinks best.
