Thirdly I give and bequeath to my Son Eaton Christian, and my Daughter Nancy, who intermarries with Isaac Hill all the monies that I am intitled to as a claimant in consequence of a Mercantile Partnership entered into by Patrick Christian & Co and Christian and Eaton to them and their heirs forever. Fourth & Lastly I give and bequeath to my two grand Sons John & Linda, & to and Henry & Timberlake the balance of my estate & every kind and description except that herebefore given to be given into the hands of Wm A Christian whom I appoint as my executor to this my last Will and Testament, who is authorized to appropriate the same in any manner he thinks best.
