 Will being weak and sick but in my perfect senses do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following. -

It is my will and desire that my daughter Mary Ann Demorelle may live on the plantation that her father John O Winston formerly lived on until my son Felix Winston arrives to the age

of twenty one years. - It is my will that all my interest in Mary Austins down right, all my money in the hands of Moseby Shephard, Anderson Grubbs, Robert Spolswood Austen - my shares in the Turnpike road & 745 dollars in the hands of Mr Peter Demoville be equally divided between my son Felix Winston, and my daughter Mary Ann Demoville, and it is my will and desire that all the property I have given to my daughter Mary Ann Demoville be placed in the hands of Moseby Shephard and Anderson Grubbs as Trustees, and that the said Trustees are to hold the same for my daughters benefit, and that my son Felix Winston may also be one the Trustees in addition to the two above mentioned. - It is my wish that my negro woman Ally be sold as soon as the Trustees can get a good price, and the money equally divided between my son and daughter before mentioned. - It is my will and desire that all my negroes and all the rest of my estate (except the silver bought of Temple Demoville) be equally divided between my son Felix Winston and my daughter Mary Ann Demoville & the silver bought of Temple Demoville I give to my daughter Mary Ann Demoville and child. - I do appoint Moseby Shephard, Anderson Grubbs and Felix Winston executors to this my last will and Testament, and it is also my will and desire that all the Estate left by me to my daughter Mary Ann Demoville be placed in the hands of the Trustees and executors before mentioned for my said daughters benefit. - It is my wish that my executors may give Mr Peter Demoville all the indulgence that the estate will admit off. - Given under my hand and seal this 9th of May 1820. -

Susanna Winston 

At a Court held for Charles City County at the Court house on Thursday the 20th day of July 1820 - This last will and Testament of Susanna Winston deceased, was produced in Court and proved by the oaths of John Royall John C Nelson and Temple E Demoville witnesses to the same and ordered to be recorded. - And at another Court held for the said County at aforesaid the 21st day of June 1821 - Anderson Grubbs one of the executors and Trustees named in the said will personally appeared in Court and renounced the executorship and Trusteeship of the same; whereupon on the motion of Moseby Shephard an executor also in the said will named, who made oath that he according to Law and with Anderson Grubbs had solemnly entered into and acknowledged abroad in the presence of 5 witnesses and dollars conditioned as the Law directs, and that he granted the said Shephard for obtaining a probate of said will in due form Subst being received to Felix Winston the other executors named in said will to join in the probate when he may think fit. - Teste Geo.
