 all my estate during her minority, or natural life; except the legacies
 hereafter mentioned. Item, I give to my son John Southall the tract of Land
 on which I now reside, also one Negro boy named James and my silver watch;
 but should my son John die before he arrives to lawfull age or without issue
 the said boy James ~~and watch~~ to revert to my daughter Suleilda Southall
 Item, I give to my daughter Suleilda Southall two negro girls to wit Isabella
 and Nancy; but should my daughter Suleilda die before she arrives to the
 age of sixteen years or without issue then the said negro girls Isabella and
 Nancy revert to my son John Southall - My next and desire is that the
 money arising from the sale of my land lying and situated in the lower end
 of this County, sold to Edmund Borum, when received, shall be applied to the
 payment of my debts; and as soon as payment shall be made by the said
 Edmund Borum for the lands above mentioned, that my executors make to
 said Borum, good, ample and sufficient Deed of Conveyance to the same.
 My next and desire is that should my two children John and Suleilda die
 before they arrive to lawfull age or without issue, that the Negroes herein
 after named, to wit, Rachael and her Child Molly, Anne, Isham, Billy
 and Filda together with their increase shall go to my wife Maria Southall
 and her heirs forever - And lastly I nominate my wife Maria Southall
 my executrix and my friend Col. John Bradley executor to this my last
 will - Given under my hand and seal the 23rd March 1815.
