Agreeably to an Order of Charles City County Court, We the subscribers have stated and examined the account of the executor of Col: William Byrd. We have examined an account returned by Commissioners in the year 1785. another returned in 1790; & another account left by Mary Byrd which has never been passed by Commissioners; on an examination of which and of all the vouchers in support of payments made by the executor, we find that at the death of Mary Byrd there was due her from the estate of Col: William Byrd the sum of eleven hundred and forty four pounds twelve shillings & one penny (1134.12.1) exclusive of her Commissions and of Interest; We allow her 2½ per Centum Commissions on all moneys received by her, and 2½ per Centum on all moneys paid for the estate; We also allow her interest at the rate of five per Centum per annum on the balance in her favour at the end of each year, on striking a balance between the payments & Receipts of that particular year; & we charge her with interest at the rate of five per Cent per annum on the balance in favour of the estate at the end of each year, on striking a balance between the payments & Receipts of that particular year: where it appears to us that Mary Byrd has sold any of her furniture slaves we give credit to the estate for the full value and charge it with one third of their full value; it appearing to us on a view of all circumstances that the life estate of Mary Byrd in said slaves is to be estimated at one third their full value.
