I Joseph Ladd of the County of Charles City & State of Virginia being under bodily indisposition but of sound mind and memory, being desirous of making distribution of the estate which kind prudence hath been pleased to bestow me with; to make and ordain this present instrument of writing to be my last Will and testament in manner and form following. - First. My will and desire is that my executor hereafter named shall at his discretion sell and dispose of all my estate both real and personal and out of the money thence arising first fully pay all my just debts, and then satisfy the further provisions of this my will. - And I do hereby vest in my said executor full power and authority to sell and convey as above mentioned any and every part of my lands or estate. - Item I give & bequeath to my living sister Elizabeth Carris the sum of One hundred pounds to her and her heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to my living sister Ann Bates the sum of One hundred pounds to her and her heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to the children of my dead brother James D Ladd to wit, Oliver and Anna Maria Ladd the sum of One hundred pounds to be paid each of them as they arrive at lawful age or shall marry.

In the name of God amen I William Christian of Charles City County being of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following that is to say - Item my will and desire is that my tract of land called Meaney's on Chickahominy river on the East side of Little Stone Run and joining of Warren's land & Mountcastle and Jordons, unto Doiglups down to the aforesaid river containing four hundred and fifteen acres shall be sold by my executors and the money arising from the said sale be equally divided between my sons hereafter named to wit; Jones & Christian, Henry B. Christian, Edmund Christian, George H. Christian, Wyatt Christian and Frederick Christian, to them and their heirs forever, but if my son Jones A. Christian will pay unto his five brothers two hundred pounds current money each for their proportion of the said land then my will and desire is that he may have the said tract of land to him and his heirs forever - Item I give unto my son Jones A. Christian the following Negro slaves to wit; Charles, Abby, and her son Peter to him and his heirs forever, Item I give to my son Henry B. Christian the following negro slaves to wit; Ned and Amey to him and his heirs forever - Item I give to my Daughter Jenny Warren a Negro boy named Jacob to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughter Patsy Christian one negro girl named Suckey to her and her heirs forever. Item I give to my Daughter Frances Christian one negro girl named Sitty to her and her heirs forever - Item I give unto my son Thomas Christian the land and plantation wherein I now live containing five hundred acres more or less and bounded by the run called Storri - on each side up to the path that leads from Armitstead News to Addams old plantation to him and his heirs forever, but my will is that I lend to my loving wife Sally Christian the use of the said land and plantation during her life - Item I give unto my son Alexander Christian my land lying above news path joining my son Thomas including the tract called Folly the whole containing three hundred acres more or less to him and his heirs forever - Item my will and desire is that one third of my stock of Horses, cattle, sheep and Hogs and one third part of my household furniture shall be sold for the benefit of my wife and my seven children had by her and the money arising from the said sale to be equally divided between my said wife and my said seven children had by her to them and their heirs forever - Item my will and desire is that the other two thirds of my stock and household & kitchen furniture shall remain on the plantation for the support of my wife and seven children had by her during my Wifes widowhood and if my said wife shall marry again my will and desire is that the said property shall be sold and the money arising from the said sale to be equally divided between my said wife and my seven children had by her to them and their heirs forever. Item my will and desire is that all my negro slaves and outstanding debts and every other species of property not already given away in this my will after my just debts is paid to be equally divided between my loving wife and my seven children had by her to wit; Thomas Christian, Patsy Christian, George H. Christian, Wyatt Christian, Alexander Christian, Frederick Christian and Frances Christian to them and their heirs forever, my will and desire is that a division of the said property shall take place when my wife shall marry again or my son Thomas or Daughter Patsy shall come to age or shall marry at either of which periods a division is to take place and until a division shall be made my desire is that the slaves shall be partly hired out only leaving a sufficient number to work the plantation to advantage - Item my will and desire is my executors hereafter named shall be guardians to my five youngest children and that any part of the property left to my four youngest sons they may dispose of as they may think fit for their education - Item and lastly I do appoint my son Robert Christian and Jones A. Christian executors to this my last will and testament revoking all others given under my hand and seal this 19th of December 1808

by Robert Christian and Jones R. Christian the executors therein named which being offered for proof, and there being no subscribing Witnesses to the same there upon came John Bradley, Henry Vaughan and Hamlin Wilcox who being duly sworn deposed and said that they were well acquainted with the said Christian, and with his hand writing, that they have frequently seen him write and that the said will and testament is wholly written by the said William Christian thereupon the said will is ordered to be recorded, and is truly recited And on the motion of the said executors who made oath as the law directs and entered into bond and security in the penalty of twenty five thousand Dollars conditioned according to Law - certificate is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in due form

In the name of God Amen I David Proper of Charles City — being weak in body but of perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament principally and first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it; as to my body I recommend it to the ground, to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner, at the discretion of my executors. And as touching such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give devise and dispose of in manner and form following Item. After my just debts are paid; I give and bequeath to my son John Proper four Negroes which he hath now in his possession Nist. Mary, Lotsey, Randal and Debby; also an equal proportion of my household furniture, stocks, and crops, which shall be hereafter given, also his equal proportion of Kitchen furniture; to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son William Proper his children, one Negro Boy named Jeph, one Negro Woman named Isbelle and her increase (or children) also their equal proportion of Household and Kitchen furniture stocks and crops, which shall not be hereafter given, to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to grand son David Smith, two Negro girls i.e. Sitter and Savina to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my grand son Edward Phillips two Negro girls i.e. slate and Salley to him and his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Maddill two negroes i.e. Abourning and Till also her equal proportion of the household and Kitchen furniture; stocks and crops, which shall not be hereafter given, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Lucy Heath, three negroes i.e. Rachel, Hanny and Betty, also her equal proportion of the Household and Kitchen furniture; stocks and crops, which shall not be hereafter given to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebecca, three Negroes i.e. Nan, Sucinda and Bela one Bed and furniture, one Bay horse (called Doctor) one side Saddle and Bridle; two choice bows, one flet wheel, one choice looking glass and whilst she shall remain single, the privilege of the dwelling house and Kitchen; half a dozen choice chairs and one small Walnut Table; also her equal proportion of the household and Kitchen furniture, stocks and crops; which shall not be hereafter disposed of, to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath to my son George Proper one certain tract or parcel of land adjoining my house plantation and bounded as follows Nist. begining at the head of bold Bradley's Mill pond, thence up the brook ^{the} line to branch leading to the roaring Spring, thence along William Hewlets line to George Hubbard, thence to crews line, thence to Bates's line thence to bold John Bradley's line, thence down the said line to the Mill pond; thence along the pond to the place began at; also three negroes i.e. Emanuel, Jude and Davy, one Bed and furniture, one Horse called (Victorious) one saddle and Bridle; two bows second choice; also his proportionable part of the Household and Kitchen furniture, stocks and crops which shall not be hereafter given; and my wish is
