In the name of God Amen, I Elizabeth R. Hurst of the County of Charles City and parish of Mestover being sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and sound senses and memory, thanks be given unto God, do make and addain this to be my last Will and testament. I Item I lend my Lands whereon I now live unto William New during his life, and at his death I give it to my granddaughter Elizabeth R. T. New and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter Elizabeth R. T. New a Negro girl named Fiecy. It is my will that my son in Law William New shall have the use of two hundred Dollars untill my granddaughter Elizabeth E. New arrives at Lawful age or marries then to be paid to her. all the money I leave in the House I wish to be equally divided between my two gran daughters. I give to each of my grand Daughters when they marry or become of Lawful age a good Bed and furniture. all the rest of the property I have in possession I lend to my son in Law untill either of my granddaughters Marries or becomes of age and then I give to my ~~son~~ ^{son in Law} ~~one~~ ^{one} third of said property, the other two thirds to be equally divided between my two granddaughters Elizabeth R. T. New and Elizabeth E. New, if either of my granddaughters should die before they marry or become of Lawful age it is my wish that the other should have the above Legacies, whatever I am entitled to from my brother Travis Harwoods Estate I give to my two granddaughters, and whatever I am entitled to from James Hurts Estate I give to my two granddaughters, to be equally divided between them and what may be due me from my Mothers Estate to be equally divided.

lastly I constitute nominate and appoint my son in law Mr New and my Nephew Samuel M. Harwood my whole and sole executors of this my last Will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this 1st day of January one thousand eight hundred and twenty One.
