I give to my niece Nancy H Glidewell a tract of land lying in the County of Dinwiddie containing by survey one hundred and thirty acres purchased by me of Joseph Haxall, also all my stock of hogs and cattle, all my money and the residue of my estate I give to Willes Browder my nephew my said nephew to have my interest in the bricks I made on Mr Joseph Haxall's plantation which interest is half mine by paying half of the expences.. And lastly I nominate and appoint Thomas Browder my executor to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I do set my hand and affix my seal this first day of February in the year one thousand eight hundred & seventeen
