If it should so happen that Sarah E Dancy my granddaughter should die before she arrives to the years of twenty One or married, the part intended for her my will and desire is it shall be equally divided between Mary E Lamb and Mary E Thompson. And lastly I appoint William Gellajor and John Lamb my Executors to this my last will and testament, and revoking all others do constitute and Ordain this my last will and testament.
