This indenture made this first day of June thousand eight hundred and eight between Thomas Stagg and Samuel Demoville overseers of the poor for the first district in the County of Charles City of the one part and George King of said County of the other part. Witnesseth that the said Thomas Stagg and Samuel Demoville overseers of the poor as aforesaid by virtue of an order of the Court of the aforesaid County bearing date May quarterly term one thousand eight hundred and eight have put placed and bound and by these presents, do put place and bind William King of the age of _____ years to be an apprentice with him the said George King and as an apprentice with him the said George King to dwell from the date of these presents until the said William King shall come to the age of twenty one years according to the act of the General Assembly in that case made and provided - By and during all which time and the said William King shall the said George King his said Master well and faithfully serve in all such lawful business as the said William King shall be put unto by his said Master, according to the power, wit and ability of him the said William King, and honestly and obediently in all things shall behave himself towards his said Master and honestly and orderly towards the rest of the family of the said George King: And the said George King, for his part, for himself, his executors and administrators, doth hereby promise and covenant to and with the said overseers of the poor, and every of them, their and every of their executors and administrators, and their and every of their successors for the time being, and to and with the said William King that the said George King shall the said William King in the craft, mystery and occupation of a cooper which he the said George King now useth after the best manner that he can or may teach, instruct and inform, or cause to be taught, instructed and informed as much as thereunto belongeth, or in anywise appertaineth: And that the said George King shall also find and allow unto the said apprentice sufficient meat, drink, apparel, washing, lodging, and all other

things needfull, or meet for an appointed during the term aforesaid - And also that the said George King will and shall moreover pay to the said William King the sum of twelve dollars, at the expiration of the said term - In witness whereof the parties to these presents have interchangeably set their hands and seals the day and year above written
