In the name of God Amen! I William Lightfoot of Tedington, in the County of Charles City, being of sound and disposing mind and memory, and reflecting the uncertainty of human life, do make and ordain the following to be my last, and testament hereby revoking all other and former wills by me at any time made My soul I bequeath into the hands of Almighty God relying with full hope on his mercy and goodness; and my body I desire to be decently interred in the family burying ground at Tedington, where most of my relations lie. First having executed a deed for the greater part of my slaves and other personal estate to William Allen Esquire of Surry, in trust, with certain reservations therein expressed, I do hereby confirm to my several children therein named by my first Wife and to my son in law George Blakey, all the estate to them respectively thereby given, or mentioned therein to be given to them respectively, whether of Slaves, Money, house, or any other thing. Secondly To My Wife Ann Hopton Lightfoot, I devise and bequeath her dower in one third of the lands, now belonging to me for her life, and her distributive share of the personal estate now remaining to me, meaning to give to her therein her legal rights and no more. Thirdly To my children by my present Wife Ann Hopton Lightfoot, who have not been yet baptized, but are called Robert Amistead Lightfoot, and Sarah Lightfoot, and to any child, be it a son or a daughter, with whom she may be pregnant at the time of my Death, I give four hundred Dollars each

to be paid in equal proportions by my sons William Howell Lightfoot, and Philip John Lightfoot out of the portions of my estate herein severally devised or bequeathed to them - Fourthly: I give and bequeath to my Daughter Mary Elizabeth Belling Blakey any two negro girls, whom she may choose out of my estate, to be delivered to her or her husband, whereever they shall be demanded. Fifthly: I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Ann Locke Lightfoot any two negro girls, whom she may choose out of my estate, to be delivered to her, when they shall be demanded. Sixthly: I give, devise and bequeath to my son Philip John Lightfoot, his heirs and assigns forever, (subject however to the condition herein after mentioned) my estate in Charles City County, called Manbury, purchased of the late William Arvell Coche, containing nine hundred and thirty two acres more or less. Also one other plantation in Charles City County, below George Abinger's, called my upper quarter, as it is now laid off in three shifts; Also my land in Charles City County called Hemmors, containing eight hundred and ten acres - more or less. Also my land in Charles City County, called Tommahund, purchased of Thomas Walker and William Morecock, containing six hundred acres more or less. - Also the Ferry in Charles City County called Dancy's with the land belonging to the said Ferry, purchased of John Dancy; and also the land in Charles City County purchased of Col^d John Bradley; and also the land in Charles City County, purchased of the executors of Dancy Bradley; And also the land in Charles City County purchased of James Walker on Moses's creek, under a deed of trust to John Backhurst, and sold by him to me for which I have paid him. And two hundred acres of land in Charles City County adjoining the said lands so purchased from the said James Walker as aforesaid, Also all my houses and lots in the city of Williamsburg and in the Town of York; also one moiety of the lots in the Town of Petersburg purchased of Patrick White's trustees, on which are stores, one half of which are mine: Also my lots at low point in Surry County; and also one half of my remaining slaves and their present and future increase: Nevertheless upon this condition, that if he the said Philip John Lightfoot dies before he arrives at the age of twenty one years, then all the lands and real estate in this sixth clause to him given shall belong to, and be vested in my other two sons by my first Wife, William Howell Lightfoot and Francis Lightfoot, and the slaves and other personal estate among all my children by my first Wife, to them and their heirs and assigns forever: And the said Philip John Lightfoot shall not take possession of the said estate, until he does actually arrive at the age of twenty one years - Seventhly I give devise bequeath and confirm to my son Francis Lightfoot his heirs and assigns forever, all the lands in Superb County, and all the slaves and other personal property which I have given him by deeds made on the twelfth day of January 1809; And I hope he will think that I have given him the full means of a genteel Maintenance. But if my said Wife Ann Lofton Lightfoot obtains from those lands in Superb County a third or any other part, for her dower, then I give to the said Francis Lightfoot to be paid to him yearly by the said William Howell Lightfoot and Philip John Lightfoot in equal proportions out of the estates hereby giving them as much money as that dower in the superb lands shall be worth in rent, to be paid during the said Ann Lofton Lightfoot's life and no longer. Eighthly. all the rest residue and remainder of my estate real personal and mixed, and especially the rest, residue and remainder of my lands in Charles City County, except however one half of my remaining slaves, and their present and future increase, which I have given as aforesaid to my son Philip John Lightfoot, I give, devise and bequeath to the said William Howell Lightfoot his heirs and assigns forever; let that estate lie or be in whatsoever County, within or out of the United States of America and consist of whatsoever it may. Ninthly I nominate and appoint to be executors of this my last will and testament my worthy friends the said William Allen, his excellency Governor John Tyler, and George Blakey esquire, and also constitute them guardians of my son Phillip John Lightfoot and my Daughter Ann Locke Lightfoot whom I commit to their affectionate care, hereby giving them full power to make division and partition of the estates aforesaid according to the provisions of this my will, without resorting to any Court - whatsoever, but calling at their discretion for the advice of able counsel. Lastly my confidence is such in the honor and integrity of those friends, whom I have just named as my executors, and guardians of my said children

that I direct, that no security be required of any one or more of them, in the character of executors or guardians. In testimony, whereof I have hereunto signed my name and affixed my seal, this twenty seventh day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine

Bridget and children, Aggy, So, Daniel Day, Mary, Jimmy, Judy, Letty and her children, Amy, Selvia, Dice and her children, Dandridge, Ginty, Dido and her children, Penny, Sally, being a part of those reserved to myself under the deed, which I have lately executed to William Allen and others, and of the choice which I have made in pursuance thereof given under my hand and seal this eight day of June 1809

forever, - It's my wish and desire, that every kind of my property not heretofore disposed of
should be sold, first, to pay all my just debts, and the remainder to be equally divided,

In the name of God Amen. I William Howell Lightfoot late of the County of Charles City: but at present residing on Cabin point in the County of Surry, being of sound mind and disposing memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and being desirous to dispose of all such worldly estate as it has pleased God to bless me with, I give and bequeath the same in manner and form following, that is to say. 1st. I desire my Executor, or executors hereafter named will - after my decease proceed to collect my Debts and out of the Monies - arising therefrom to pay all just claims against me, and if insufficient for that purpose, that they dispose of such part of my personal Estate that can be most conveniently spared to aid in discharge of my aforementioned just debts. 2^d. After my just debts and funeral expences are paid I give and bequeath my whole Estate consisting of Lands given me by my late Father William Lightfoot, either by his last Testament, Deed of Gift, or otherwise, also all my Negroes, Stock, and of every other Species of property I may die possessed of, to be equally divided between my beloved Wife Sarah Short Lightfoot and my Son William Lightfoot, to them and their Heirs or Assigns forever. 3^d. Should it happen that my Son William Lightfoot dies previous to his arrival to the Age of Twenty One years. I then give the whole of my Estate of what kind soever to my beloved Wife Sarah Short Lightfoot her heirs or Assigns. - And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my beloved Wife Sarah S. Lightfoot, my friends James H. Court and William Allen, Executors of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills and Testaments by me heretofore made. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 13th. day of April One thousand eight hundred and Ten. Which several balances ought in our opinion to carry Interest from the times they respectively became due. On the 1st January 1815 there was a balance due the Executor of \$173.49 on which he ought to have Interest on the principals above. At the request of the Executor we state that by the Will of his testator Mr. John Minge is entitled to one half of the profits of the Estate and that he has proceeded to settle so much ^{thereof} with Mr. Minge.
