In the name of God Amen, I William Murrell of Charles City County being very sick and weak of body, but of perfect mind & memory thanks be to God, calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say, principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my executors nothing doubting but it will be raised at the general resurrection by the Almighty power of God; And as to such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased

pleased God to bless me in this life, I give devise and dispose  
of the same, on the following manner and form. - First. I give and  
bequeath to Anna my dearly beloved wife whom I also constitute
