In the name of God amen, I William Vance of the County of Charles City being sick but of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. My soul I recommend to Almighty God, who gave it, me, Hoping through the merits and intercession of my blessed saviour Jesus Christ to obtain a pardon for my offences towards God & Man. My body to be committed to the earth, and decently interred at the discretion of my Executor, and Executors hereafter mentioned, and as to the worldly estate with which it has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath the same in manner and form following. In pursuance of my Will and desire is that as soon as may be after my death my Executor and Executors hereafter mentioned shall dispose of one or more of my Negroes to pay my just debts and funeral expenses, and if there is any money remaining therefrom to be considered as part of my estate. Item my Will and desire further is that my loving wife shall have the use of my remaining estate during her widowhood for the support and

Education of my children. In case she marries my desire is she shall be put to one third as the law directs, and at her death to revert to my estate. Item. My will and desire is that all my estate shall be equally divided among my surviving children as soon as the eldest comes of age or either of them shall be married, which proportion I give to them & their heirs forever. Lastly. I do hereby appoint my friend Henry Amos a joint and joint Executor and my loving wife Executrix of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I hereunto set my hand and affix my seal this seventeenth day of February One thousand eight hundred and seven Signed sealed and acknowledged } William X Name
