 heirs forever, and lastly I constitute and appoint my friend Nancy

Bradley my Executor. Witness my hand and seal this 30th
 Day of September One thousand eight hundred.

Charles City County, Virginia Wills 1789-1808
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A Court held for Charles City County at the Courthouse on
Thursday the 16th day of October 1780. The aforesaid last will
and testament of William Gray deceased was put into Court by Nancy
Bradley the executor therein named and being proved by the Oaths
of James Walker and John Ammons the witnesses thereto, is ordered to be
recorded, and on the motion of the said executor, who made oath as the
law directs, certificate is granted him for obtaining a probat thereof
in due form, and thereupon he together with John Bradley and
John Bowry senior his securities entered into and acknowledged
their bond in the penalty of three thousand dollars conditioned as
the law directs.
